Dear Honorable Mayor Rebollo:

After carefully considering all of the testimony of staff, all documents, and other matters related to the November 16, 2017 Public Hearing to consider the issuance of Compliance Order CO 017-003 (Compliance Order) for the City of Commerce (City), the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) has determined that placing the City on a Compliance Order is consistent with statute. CalRecycle has approved the Compliance Order. For your reference, attached is a signed copy of both the Request for Action and the Compliance Order.

According to the Compliance Order's schedule, the City is to work with CalRecycle staff to determine gaps in program areas and develop a Local Implementation Plan (LIP) to improve, expand, or implement new diversion programs. I directed my staff to contact City staff by next week to schedule a meeting. The City shall develop and submit to CalRecycle a fully executed LIP no later than March 2, 2018.
