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12. Legal Description of Facility:

The legal description is described as, a portion of Section 3, T10N/R12W, SBB&M, and portions of Sections 26, 27, 34 and 35, T11N, R12W, SBB&M

13. Findings:

- a. This solid waste facility permit is consistent with the Kern County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (now CalRecycle) on February 25, 1998 and last revised in April 2004. The location of the facility is identified in the Countywide Siting Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by CalRecycle pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the local enforcement agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. An Environmental Impact Report (SCH #1998071109), as required by Public Resources Code, Section 21081.6 was certified and approved on October 2, 2012. The CEQA document describes and supports the design and operation, which will be authorized by the issuance of this permit. A Notice of Determination was posted on October 25, 2012.

14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Liquid waste sludge, nonhazardous waste requiring special handling or Hazardous waste, radioactive, medical (as defined in Chapter 6.1, Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code), liquid, designated waste, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Joint Technical Document (JTD) and approved amendments thereto, as approved by the enforcement agency and other federal, state, and local agencies. Universal Waste, as defined in California Code of Regulations Title 22, such as used motor oil, and Cathode Ray tubes (CRT) devices may be accepted for recycling or offsite disposal purposes as described in the JTD and approved by the LEA.

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16. Self Monitoring:

Except for items **a** and **b**, the owner/operator shall submit the results of self-monitoring programs to the Enforcement Agency within 30 days of the end of the reporting period (*for example, 1st quarter = January – March, the report is due by April 30, etc.. Information required on an annual basis shall be submitted with the 4th quarter monitoring report.*)

a. Notify the LEA in the event of any of the following: fires, landslides, earthquake damage, unusual and sudden settlements, injury and property damage accidents, explosions, receipt or rejection of unpermitted wastes, flooding and other unusual occurrences. Document the event in the Special Occurrence Daily Log book.	Within 24 hours of the event
b. Maintain a written record and notify the LEA of any nuisance, public health or safety complaint.	Within 24 hours of the event
c. Submit a report of actions taken by the operator to remedy or correct any major incidents such as fires, landslides, earthquake damage, unusual and sudden settlements, injury and property damage accidents, explosions, receipt or rejection of unpermitted wastes, flooding and other unusual occurrences.	Within 30 days of the event
d. Results of the hazardous waste load checking program, including the quantities and types of hazardous wastes, medical wastes or otherwise prohibited wastes found in the waste stream and the disposition of these materials.	Quarterly
e. Results of the landfill gas monitoring program.	Quarterly
f. Reports of peak daily wind speeds specific to the site, during hours of operation.	Quarterly
g. The number and types of vehicles using the facility per day.	Annual Summary
h. The types and quantities (in tons) of waste, including separated or commingled recyclables, diverted from the facility.	Annual Summary
i. Remaining site capacity.	Annually

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17. Enforcement Agency (EA) Conditions:

- a. The operator shall comply with State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 14 and Title 27 California Code of Regulations (CCR).
- b. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences, as per Title 27 Section 20510(c). This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous wastes, and significant injuries, accidents or property damage. The log shall be available for inspection by authorized representatives of the LEA and CalRecycle during normal business hours.
- c. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the EA.
- d. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 3,000 tons per day, and shall not exceed this amount without obtaining a revision of this permit.
- e. This permit is subject to review by the EA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the EA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resource Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq. and associated regulations.
- f. The LEA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations when deemed necessary due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
- g. Any change in the operation or design of the facility which does not conform with the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of a Report of Facility Information amendment, to the LEA at least 180 days in advance of the change.
- h. A copy of this permit shall be maintained at the facility.
