12. Legal Description of Facility:

5960 El Camino Real, Carlsbad, San Diego County, CA 29008; Assessor Parcel Numbers 97-0085-A1; and as described on pages 3 and A-1 on Appendix A of the Transfer Processing Report, dated June 2015.

13. Findings:

- a) A County-wide Integrated Waste Management Plan was approved by the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) in March, 2011. Pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC) §50001(b), this facility is not required to comply with PRC §50001. This facility is not a disposal facility, a transformation facility, or an EMSW conversion facility, nor a facility which is designed to recover for reuse or recycling at least 5 percent of the total volume of material received by the facility.
- b) The LEA has determined that the design of the facility would allow for the facility operations to be conducted in compliance with State Minimum Standards for Transfer/Processing Operations and Facilities, based on a review of the June 2015 Transfer Processing Report and an inspection conducted on September 23, 2015.
- c) This permit is consistent with standards adopted by the CalRecycle, pursuant to Public Resources Code, §44010.
- d) The LEA has reviewed and considered the information, including the environmental effects of issuing this solid waste facility permit contained in the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR), SCH # 2003071175, dated September 2004 and certified by the City Council of the City of Carlsbad (Resolution No. 2005-029) on February 1, 2005 and finds there are no significant unmitigable environmental effects arising out of its issuance.

14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting any liquid waste sludge, non-hazardous waste requiring special handling, designated waste, hazardous waste, untreated bio-hazardous waste, waste containing more than 50% water, friable and non-friable asbestos, large dead animals or part thereof, and radioactive waste.

16. LEA Conditions:

- a) The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling.
- b) The operator shall maintain a copy of this permit, Transfer Processing Report (TPR), and a copy of or access to State Minimum Standards for Transfer/Processing Operations and Facilities at the site at all times.
- c) Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement changes without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of a Transfer Processing Report amendment, to the LEA at least 180 days in advance of the proposed change.

16. LEA Conditions: Continued

- d) Without prior written approval by the LEA to allow otherwise, the facility may only operate as described in the most recent version of the Transfer Processing Report.
- e) This permit is subject to review by the LEA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the LEA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the PRC, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq.
- f) Additional information related to compliance with this permit or the design and operation of this facility shall be furnished to the LEA upon request.
- g) The operator shall maintain, and keep current, records of weight and types of waste received per day. Co-mingled and non-source separated recyclables shall be counted toward total daily tonnage. These records shall include the final disposition of transferred waste and recycled materials.
- h) Copies of records required shall be maintained on site for review by the LEA (or submitted to the LEA upon request).
- i) Stored recyclables shall not interfere with facility operation or cause a public nuisance as determined by the LEA. The maximum storage time for salvaged or recycled material shall not exceed 90 days. The LEA reserves the right to reduce the maximum storage time of recyclables as necessary to protect public health or prevent a nuisance.
- j) If the proposed dust control measures described in the Transfer Processing Report (TPR) fail to adequately control dust from the operation of this facility, the LEA may require that additional measures be implemented.
