12. Legal Description of Facility:

6700 Federal Blvd, Lemon Grove, CA 91945; Assessor Parcel Numbers 4781603400.

13. Findings:

- a) A 2012 County-wide Integrated Waste Management Plan Five Year Plan Review Report was approved by the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) in March 2013. Pursuant to Public Resource Code (PRC) §50001(b), this facility is not required to comply with PRC 50001. This solid waste facility is not a disposal facility, a transformation facility, or an Engineered Municipal Solid Waste conversion facility.
- b) The LEA has determined that the design of the facility would allow for the facility operations to be conducted in compliance with State Minimum Standards for Transfer/Processing Operations and Facilities, based on a review of the July 2015 Transfer Processing Report and an inspection conducted on August 10, 2015.
- c) This permit is consistent with standards adopted by the CalRecycle. Public Resources Code, §44010.
- d) The LEA has reviewed and considered the information, including the environmental effects of issuing this Solid Waste Facility Permit for the existing materials recovery facility for commingled and source separated recyclables. The LEA filed a Notice of Exemption on June, 2010 for the continued operation of this facility and finds that there are no significant environmental effects arising out of the issuance of this Solid Waste Facility Permit (SWFP). A Notice of Exemption will be filed with the State Clearinghouse upon issuance of the SWFP.

15. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting anything other than commingled/source separated recyclable materials.

16. LEA Conditions:

- a) The operator shall comply with all the State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling.
- b) Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of an RFI amendment, to the EA at least 180 days in advance of the change. Stored recyclables shall not interfere with facility operations or cause a public health nuisance as determined by the LEA. The LEA reserves the right to reduce the maximum storage time of recyclables as necessary to protect health or prevent a nuisance.
- c) If the dust control measures, as described in the Transfer Processing Report (TPR), fail to adequately control dust from the operation of this facility, the LEA may require that additional measures be implemented.
- d) The operator shall maintain, and keep current, records of the types and weights of materials received per day. These records shall include the final disposition of transferred residual waste and recycled materials.
- e) The residual waste amount is calculated on a monthly basis based on the number of operating days by measuring the outgoing tonnage after separated for reuse materials have been removed.
- f) The amount of putrescible wastes in the separated for reuse material shall be less than 1% of the amount of separated for reuse material received by weight. The putrescible waste in the separated for reuse material shall not cause a nuisance as determined by the LEA.
- g) Additional information related to compliance with this permit or the design and operation of this facility shall be furnished to the LEA upon request.
- h) This permit is subject to review by the LEA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the LEA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resource Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq and associated regulations.
- i) The operator shall maintain a copy of this permit, the Transfer Processing Report (TPR), and a copy of or access to State Minimum Standards for Transfer/Processing Stations at the site at all times.
