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## 12. Legal Description of Facility:

The Santa Clara County Assessor's Parcel Numbers for the property are 729-51-006, 729-51-007 and 729-52-029.

The legal boundary plan for the property is shown on Figure 2-2 in the RDSI.

## 13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the Santa Clara County Integrated Waste Management Plan (November, 1995), which was approved by CalRecycle on June, 1996. The location of the facility is identified in the Countywide Siting Plan as a Disposal Facility Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by CalRecycle, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the City of San Jose Local Enforcement Agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. The City of San Jose Fire Department has determined that the facility is in conformance with applicable fire standards, pursuant to PRC, 44151.
- e. A Negative Declaration was filed by the City of San Jose Planning Department in 1993 with the State Clearinghouse (SCH #93033053). The Negative Declaration describes and supports the design and operation which will be authorized by the issuance of this permit.
- f. The City of San Jose Planning Department has determined that the facility is 1) consistent with and designated in the general plan and 2) that the surrounding land use is consistent with the facility operation.

## 14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Hazardous, radioactive, medical (as defined in Chapter 6.1, Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code), liquid, designated, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Report of Facility Information and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the enforcement agency.

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**16. Self Monitoring:**

The owner/operator shall submit the results of all self monitoring programs to the Enforcement Agency within 30 days of the end of the reporting period (*for example, 1<sup>st</sup> quarter = January – March, the report is due by April 30, etc.. Information required on an annual basis shall be submitted with the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter monitoring report, unless otherwise stated.*)

f. Wet weather preparedness report/winter operations plan.	Annually (due November 1 <sup>st</sup> )

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## 17. Enforcement Agency (EA) Conditions:

- a. The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 14, California Code of Regulations.
- b. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires (surface and underground), explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous liquids or gases, or unpermitted wastes, and significant injuries, accidents or property damage (including slope damage). Each log entry shall be accompanied by a summary of any actions taken by the operator to mitigate the occurrence. The log shall be available to site personnel and the LEA at all times. Any of these specified entries made in this log must be immediately reported to the LEA.
- c. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the LEA.
- d. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 2,600 tons per day of solid waste and 1,000 tons per day of sludge. It shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit.
- e. This permit is subject to review by the LEA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the LEA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resource Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq and associated regulations.
- f. The LEA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
- g. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of an RFI amendment, to the LEA at least 180 days in advance of the change.
- h. A copy of this permit shall be maintained at the facility.
- i. The minimum number of random load checks per week is three (3). The LEA reserves the right to increase the required number of load checks performed per day or week.
