Summary of Request: Staff requests approval of grant awards for the Tire-Derived Product (TDP) Grant Program for Fiscal Year (FY) 2010/11.

CalRecycle received 115 applications requesting a total of \$10,634,790.52 which includes 90 eligible applications for \$8,242,826. The *Five Year Plan for Waste Tire Recycling Management Program – (5th Edition covering Fiscal Years 2009/10-2013/14) (Five-Year Plan)* allocates \$3,400,000 in FY 2010/11 for the TDP Grant Program. At the April 12, 2011 CalRecycle meeting, staff presented proposed reallocations of the Tire Recycling Management Fund for Fiscal Year 2010/11. Subsequently, the Deputy Director approved the reallocation, which included an additional \$4,104,459 for the TDP Grant Program. This brought total funding for the TDP Grant Program to \$7,504,459.


Staff evaluated the applications and ranked eligible applications consistent with the approved process. Staff disqualified 23 applications that did not satisfy Program requirements. Additionally, two applicants withdrew their requests.

Recommendation: Staff recommends approval of 83 grant awards (82 fully funded and one partially funded, as listed in Table 1 in the *Funding* section) for \$7,504,459.

Deputy Director Action: On the basis of the information and analysis in this Request for Approval and the findings set out herein, I hereby conditionally approve the grant awards for the TDP Grant Program (as listed in Table 1 in the *Funding* section). Each proposed Grantee award is conditioned upon:

1. The full payment within 90 (ninety) days of the date of this grant award of all outstanding debt(s) or scheduled payment(s) owed by the proposed Grantee to CalRecycle; and
2. The return by the proposed Grantee of a completed and executed Grant Agreement within 90 (ninety) days from the date that CalRecycle staff mails the Grant Agreement.

Background and Findings:

Statutory Authority:

Public Resources Code (PRC) Section 42872 allows grants for activities and applications that result in reduced landfill disposal or stockpiling of waste tires. The Tire-Derived Product (TDP) Grant Program (Program) operates within the authority of PRC 42872, using a portion of the annual appropriation from the California Tire Recycling Management Fund (Tire Fund).

Criteria and Process:

At the October 13, 2010, CalRecycle meeting, staff presented the Program criteria and process which the Deputy Director approved. The Program offers grants to public entities and Qualifying Indian Tribes for TDPs. The recommended funding amount is based on the estimated number of passenger tire equivalents (PTE) for the project(s), project(s) cost (subject to a maximum reimbursement of \$5 per PTE), and a maximum grant amount of \$150,000.

Staff reviewed the 115 applications. Staff disqualified 23 applications that did not satisfy Program requirements. Additionally, two applicants withdrew their requests. Because CalRecycle received more requests than available monies, staff conducted a Random Selection Drawing on April 4, 2011. This determined the funding order of the 90 eligible applications.

Funding:

The *Five-Year Plan* allocates \$3,400,000 for the TDP Grant Program for FY 2010/11. At the April 12, 2011 CalRecycle meeting, staff presented proposed reallocations of the Tire Recycling Management Fund for FY 2010/11. Subsequently, the Deputy Director approved the reallocation, which included an additional \$4,104,459 for the TDP Grant Program. This results in \$7,504,459 total allocated funds for the TDP Grant Program. Because a portion of the reallocation is from the Emergency Reserve, \$500,000 of the TDP Grant Program funding is contingent on no emergencies occurring before July 1, 2011. If additional funds become available, the Deputy Director may provide direction to fund remaining eligible TDP Grant Program applications.
