Summary of Request:

According to Public Resources Code (PRC) Section 41791.5, as a newly incorporated city, the City of Menifee should have completed and submitted its planning documents, i.e., its Source Reduction and Recycling Element (SRRE), Household Hazardous Waste Element (HHWE), and Nondisposal Facility Element (NDFE), to CalRecycle by April 1, 2010. Because the City had not submitted its planning documents by the due date, staff requested the City submit a compliance schedule by April 15, 2010. The City has submitted the requested compliance schedule, and is asking for an extension on its submittal due date until December 1, 2010 (Attachment 1).


Recommendation:

Staff has determined that the proposed timeframe is reasonable and recommends approval of the attached compliance schedule for completing and submitting the SRRE, HHWE, and NDFE by the newly incorporated City of Menifee, Riverside County.

Background Information, Analysis, and Findings:

The City of Menifee in Riverside County incorporated on October 1, 2008. According to PRC Section 41791.5, newly incorporated cities are required to submit a completed SRRE, HHWE, and NDFE within 18 months of incorporation; the City's planning documents were therefore due by April 1, 2010. A newly incorporated city has the option to either develop its own SRRE, HHWE, and NDFE, or to form/join a regional agency with its host county, and adopt the county's SRRE, HHWE, and NDFE as its own. The City of Menifee is planning to submit its own planning documents.

CalRecycle (formerly the California Integrated Waste Management Board) discussed the issue of enforcement and newly incorporated cities related to planning document submittal at its February 2002 Board meeting. It was determined that the previously adopted enforcement process for existing jurisdictions that had failed to submit adequate planning documents would also apply to newly incorporated cities. The first step of the process for a city that is late in submitting its planning documents is to submit a compliance schedule specifying what tasks remain and an expected timeline for completing and submitting the final documents to CalRecycle.

Compliance Schedule

Based upon the process developed at the February 2002 meeting, the City of Menifee was requested to submit a compliance schedule by April 15, 2010. The City submitted the required compliance schedule. Staff determined the information provided regarding tasks and timelines was specific enough to complete an analysis of the request (Attachment 2). The City estimates it could submit the following planning documents by December 1, 2010. Staff believes this schedule is reasonable.

The second step in the enforcement process is to take the proposed compliance schedule forward for CalRecycle approval. Therefore, staff is seeking approval of the time extension and the proposed compliance schedule.
