

Dear Mr. Furey:

As you are aware the City of Wildomar formally became a newly incorporated City in the County of Riverside on July 1, 2008. The purpose of this letter is to request a time extension from the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery for the City's submittal of appropriate planning documents as required per statute.

While existing statute, the Integrated Waste management Act, (AB 939, Chapter 1095, Statutes of 1989) requires newly incorporated cities to submit their planning documents to the department within eighteen months of incorporation, the statute (Chapter 343, Statutes of 2008, Wiggins, SB 1016) also requires analysis of the disposal reporting system utilizing at least 12 months of data, commencing with the most current calendar year. This effectively means that the City will not have the data available until June 15, 2010, at the earliest.

For this reason the City would like to request a revised submittal date of 180 days from whenever complete disposal data becomes available to allow the city to perform complete data analysis, review of final documents and receive formal approval from City Council.

I look forward to your positive response regarding the City of Wildomar's request.
