11. Legal Description of Facility:

Latitude and longitude: N 32° 51.363" W 117° 9.786; Township 15S,
Range 3W Section 22, 23, 24, and 25 San Bernardino Meridian

12. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the San Diego County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) on September 20-21, 2005.
- b. The LEA finds that this permit is consistent with the standards adopted by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle), pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC) 44010.
- c. The LEA has determined that the design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. An Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was filed with the State Clearinghouse (SCH# 2006051004) and certified by the City of San Diego Development Services Department on October 3, 2007. The existing EIRs describe and support the design and operation of this project, which will be authorized by the issuance of this permit. A Notice of Exemption for Existing Facilities was filed on October 15, 2014.

13. Prohibitions:

- a. The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:
Hazardous, radioactive, medical (as defined in Chapter 6.1, Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code), liquid, designated, or other hazardous wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Joint Technical Document and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the LEA and/or other federal, state, and local agencies.

15. Self Monitoring:

The owner/operator shall submit the results of all self monitoring programs to the LEA in accordance with Condition 16b below.

Program	Reporting Frequency
<p>a. Tonnage Records: The operator shall maintain and keep current all records used to determine daily tonnage.</p> <p>b. Traffic Records: The operator shall maintain and keep current a record of all vehicles hauling solid waste to the facility.</p> <p>c. Remaining Capacity: The operator shall prepare and submit a report regarding the remaining volumetric capacity at the site.</p> <p>d. Special Occurrences: A summary of special occurrences including, but not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous waste, and significant injuries, accidents, or property damage.</p>	<p>Program records shall be submitted to the LEA in accordance with LEA Condition 16b.</p>

16. LEA Conditions:

- a. Maximum permitted traffic volume is based on the number of vehicles hauling waste for disposal at the facility. The maximum number of permitted vehicles shall not exceed 2,000 vehicles per day.
- b. Tonnage, traffic, remaining capacity, and special occurrence records shall be summarized and submitted to the LEA on a quarterly basis. The reporting periods and dues dates are: January through March, due May 1; April through June, due August 1; July through September, due November 1; and October through December, due February 1.
- c. The operator shall submit to unannounced inspections during permitted hours of operation. Such inspections may occur before the start or after the end of waste deposition activities.
- d. This solid waste facilities permit is subject to review by the LEA and may be suspended or revoked at any time for sufficient cause in accordance with Division 30 of the PRC, Part 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq. and associated regulations.
- e. The operator shall maintain a complete copy of the solid waste facility permit and JTD available at the site at all times.
- f. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement changes without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of a Report of Facility Information amendment, at least 180 days in advance of the proposed change unless otherwise determined by the EA.
- g. Additional information related to compliance with this permit or information concerning the design and operation of this facility shall be furnished to the LEA upon request.
- h. The LEA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations due to an emergency.
- i. Seven of the 24 monitoring perimeter probes are now incorporated into the solid waste facility permitted boundary through an agreement with the United States of America, Department of the Navy for the purpose of maintenance and to monitor for methane gas migration. Detailed information regarding these probes is included in the April 2014 JTD.
