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## 12. Legal Description of Facility:

The legal description of this facility is contained in Page 3 section B of the Recology San Bruno Transfer Processing Report dated March 2014.

## 13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the San Mateo County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by CalRecycle on October 26, 1999. The location of the facility is identified in the Countywide Siting Element or Non-disposal Facility Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by CalRecycle, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the enforcement agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. The City of San Bruno Fire Department has determined that the facility is in conformance with applicable fire standards, pursuant to PRC, 44151.
- e. A Negative Declaration was filed with the State Clearinghouse SCH #99112039 and certified by the City of San Bruno on January 20, 2000 and a Notice of Exemption filed by the City of San Bruno on October 22, 2003 describes and supports the design and operation which will be authorized by the issuance of this permit.

## 14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Hazardous, radioactive, medical (as defined in Chapter 6.1, Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code), liquid, designated, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Report of Facility Information and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the enforcement agency.

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## 16. Self Monitoring:

The owner/operator shall submit the results of all self monitoring programs to the Enforcement Agency within 30 days of the end of the reporting period (*for example, 1<sup>st</sup> quarter = January – March, the report is due by April 30, etc.. Information required on an annual basis shall be submitted with the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter monitoring report, unless otherwise stated.*)

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## 17. Enforcement Agency (EA) Conditions:

- a. The Current Transfer Processing Report (TPR) and any subsequent approved TPR Amendments shall reflect the current operation at this facility. The operator must file amendments to the TPR prior to making changes in the design and operation from those outlined in the TPR. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of an RFI amendment, to the EA at least 180 days in advance of the change.
- b. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the EA.
- c. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 500 tons per day, and shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit.
- d. The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 14, California Code of Regulations.
- e. The Facility Operator shall provide effective dust control and cleaning as necessary in order to control nuisance dust resulting from Facility operations, as determined by the LEA. The facility operator shall provide additional misting, watering and cleaning of equipment as frequently as necessary to mitigate dust generation.
- f. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous or unpermitted wastes, and significant injuries, accidents or property damage. Each log entry shall be accompanied by a summary of any actions taken by the operator to mitigate the occurrence. The log shall be available to site personnel and the EA at all times.
- g. This permit is subject to review by the EA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the EA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resource Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq and associated regulations.
- h. The EA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
- i. A copy of this permit shall be maintained at the facility.
