### **OLD GRASS VALLEY BURN DUMP REMEDIAL ACTION COMPLETION REPORT AND POST-CLOSURE MAINTENANCE PLAN ACCEPTANCE, NEVADA COUNTY**

Central Valley Regional Water Resources Control Board (Water Board) staff has reviewed the May 2012 *Remedial Action Completion Report* (Completion Report) and *Post-Closure Maintenance Plan* (Maintenance Plan) for the Old Grass Valley Burn Dump located in Nevada County. According to the Completion Report, the burn ash was excavated and consolidated on an approximately two-acre portion of the site. A cap was placed over the burn ash consisting of an 18-inch low permeability layer covered by a six-inch vegetated layer. Stormwater is diverted around the capped area into a rip-rap lined ditch that conveys the water into a sediment basin. Stormwater is discharged from the sediment basin from an overflow weir that discharges into a rip-rap lined channel.

The burn dump is now considered closed and in post-closure maintenance.

Water Board staff has no comments on the Completion Report or Maintenance Plan and recommends that the Maintenance Plan be implemented as written.
