## 12. Legal description of the facility.

The legal description of this facility is contained in page 1-2 of the Transfer/Processing Report dated February 2010

## 13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the San Mateo County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by the CIWMB on October 26, 1999. The location of the facility is identified in the Nondisposal Facility Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by the CIWMB, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the enforcement agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. The Daly City Fire Department has determined that the facility is in conformance with applicable fire standards, pursuant to PRC, 44151.
- e. A Mitigated Negative Declaration(MND) was filed with the State Clearinghouse (SCH #2009052099) and certified by the Daly City Council on July 13, 2009. The MND describes and supports the design and operation, which will be authorized by the issuance of this permit. A Notice of Determination was filed with the State Clearinghouse on July 14, 2009.

## 14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Hazardous, radioactive, medical (as defined in Chapter 6.1, Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code), liquid, designated, other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, and autoclaved sharps waste from large quantity generators except as identified in the Report of Facility Information and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the enforcement agency and other federal, state, and local agencies.

Information required on an annual basis shall be submitted with the 4th quarter monitoring report, unless otherwise stated.)

| g. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous or unpermitted wastes, and significant injuries, accidents or property damage. Each log entry shall be accompanied by a summary of any actions taken by the operator to mitigate the occurrence. The log shall be available to site personnel and the EA at all times. | Daily     |

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## 17. LEA Conditions:

- a. The operator shall comply with all provisions mandated under the state minimum standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 14, California Code of Regulations Chapter 3.
- b. The operator shall comply with all federal, state, and local requirements and enactment's including any mitigation measures given in any certified environmental document filed pursuant to the Public Resources Code Section 21081.6.
- c. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 500 tpd and shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit. Upon receiving the peak solid waste tonnage of 500 tpd, this facility shall prohibit on site access for any additional waste vehicles (commercial or public).
- d. The owner/operator shall keep all information of the current Transfer Processing Report updated pursuant to CCR Title 14 Section 17403.9. The LEA reserves the right to request and receive any information that it deems necessary to conduct an inspection, review and / or write a Solid Waste Facility Permit.
- e. The owner/operator of this facility shall not implement any change to this facility or operations without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change with a description of the proposed change to the LEA **at least 180 days in advance of the implementation of the change**. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit will be considered a significant change and will require a revision to this permit.
- f. All new construction shall be inspected and approved by the LEA prior to commencement of operations.
- g. This facility is permitted to receive nonhazardous municipal solid waste. This includes residential, commercial, industrial, and self-haul waste, as well as source -separated materials from curbside collection programs, commercial recycling programs, separate yard waste collection or other programs. **No designated, special, medical, liquid waste sludge or hazardous waste materials shall be accepted.** Universal wastes must be managed in accordance with applicable sections of the California code of Regulations, Title 22. A Hazardous Waste Load Checking Program shall be implemented to enforce this policy.
- h. The LEA reserves the right to suspend waste receiving operations when it is deemed necessary due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
- i. All Green waste activities and related activities shall be conducted in a manner that precludes the attraction, breeding and/or harborage of vectors.
- j. Woodwaste, greenwaste and inert materials shall not be stockpiled for more than seven (7) days. The LEA reserves the right to have any stockpiled or stored materials (including putrescibles) removed immediately where imminent public health and safety concerns exists, and reserves the right to require removal within 24-hours if it is determined that any other public nuisances exist.

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## 17. LEA Conditions Continued:

- k. All debris boxes utilized within the permitted boundary of this facility shall be cleaned and maintained at a frequency to prevent the propagation of flies, rodents other vectors and or the creation of nuisances and as specified in CCR Title 14 Section 17341 Equipment Construction.
- l. The owner/operator of this facility shall provide additional dust control and cleaning methods to the facility as necessary to mitigate dust generation resulting from facility operations as determined by the LEA and as specified in CCR Title 14 Section 17407.4 Dust Control.
- m. Station personnel shall be posted to control traffic to and from the recyclables storage bunker area. At least one station employee shall be positioned and responsible for traffic control to and from the bunker area during the hours of 6:30 am to 3:30 pm Monday thru Friday and Saturdays from 6:30 am to 10:30 am.
- n. The following cleaning and maintenance schedule shall be implemented for this facility:  
The station floor, trailer loading areas, area of the westside compactor, area in and around the recycleable bunker area and exterior grounds shall be thoroughly cleaned daily of wastes and litter as determined by the LEA.
- o. The operator shall implement bird control measures as necessary to prevent birds entering and feeding on the waste materials in the station. Additional bird control measures maybe required as determined by the LEA.
- p. The operator shall maintain a copy of this permit at the facility, so it will be available at all times to facility personnel, enforcement agency personnel and/or other duly authorized regulatory agency.
- q. This permit is subject to review by the LEA and may be suspended and/or revoked at any time for sufficient cause after a hearing by the Local Enforcement Agency's Hearing Panel.
