Dear Mr. Andrews:

On June 3, 2012, the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) received your request to continue to beneficially use waste tires as safety barriers at Altamont Raceway, located in the City of Tracy. Your request included information regarding the beneficial use of waste tires in safety barriers to reduce potential harm to race participants and the machinery without causing negative impacts to public health and safety or the environment. Staff have determined that the use of waste tires as safety barriers at the Altamont Raceway under your supervision continues to qualify as beneficial reuse as defined in Title 14, California Code of Regulations (14 CCR), Section 17346(f) and the waste tires will not be determined to be stored or disposed and use does not require the issuance of a waste tire storage facility permit from CalRecycle.

Please note that if the beneficial use of waste tires is discontinued, Altamont Raceway or the legal operator and/or business owner is fully responsible for the removal and the proper recycling or disposal of the tires in a manner consistent with the waste tire laws and regulations.

CalRecycle staff or their authorized agents are authorized by regulation to inspect and/or carry out investigations at Altamont Raceway to determine continued compliance with requirements of 14 CCR Section 17346(f) for the beneficial use of the waste tires as well as other applicable waste tire laws and regulations.
