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12. **Legal Description of Facility:** SW 1/4 S28, T5N, R1W HB&M; Broadway Blvd. (U.S. Highway 101) & Hawthorne St., Eureka; see Figure 3 of RSI.

13. **Findings:**

- a. A County Integrated Waste Management Plan (CIWMP) was approved by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) on January 22, 1997.
- b. A finding that this permit is consistent with the CIWMP is not required since this solid waste facility will recover for re-use or recycling less than 5 percent of the total volume of material received. Public Resources Code Section 50001.(b).
- c. This permit is consistent with standards adopted by the CIWMB. Public Resources Code, Section 44010.
- d. The design and operation of the facility is in compliance with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the Humboldt County Division of Environmental Health (LEA) during an inspection on May 27, 1997.
- e. The City of Eureka Fire Prevention Bureau has determined that the facility is in conformance with applicable fire standards as required in Public Resources Code, Section 44151 (inspection report of 10/2/96).
- f. A Mitigated Negative Declaration (SCH# 92093033) has been filed with the state clearinghouse and certified on March 5, 1993, by the City of Eureka Department of Community Development acting as the lead agency. A Notice of Final City Action on CDP-10-92 was prepared on April 22, 1993.

14. **Prohibitions:**

The permittee is prohibited from accepting any hazardous, radioactive, medical, liquid, sludge, designated, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Report of Station Information (RSI) and as approved by the LEA and other federal, state, and local agencies.

The permittee is additionally prohibited from accepting the following:

17. LEA Conditions:

1. This facility shall comply with all state and local statutes and regulations for solid waste transfer and processing. The operator shall inspect the site at least once each day of operation to ensure compliance with all applicable standards/ conditions/ mitigation/ permits/ regulations.
2. The operator shall notify the LEA in writing [with proposed amendments to the Report of Disposal Site Information (RSI)], at least one hundred fifty (150) days in advance of proposed significant changes (as determined by the LEA), in the design/operation of the facility to allow for early consultation, completion of all required documents/ due process review/ filing and the completion of all related permitting processes. Such notification shall also include, but not be limited to, changes (including new additions) of: processing/ composting/ baling materials recovery facility (MRF)/ transfer station and/or transformation facility, changes in permitted hours/ days of operation, permitted tons/day per category, permitted traffic volumes/day per category, and permitted total area which may be later proposed for this facility.
3. The operator shall maintain a copy of this permit at the facility so as to be available at all times to facility personnel and to regulatory agencies.
4. This SWFP is subject to review by the LEA and may be suspended, revoked or modified at any time for sufficient cause.
5. The LEA reserves the right to suspend and/or modify operations at this facility when deemed necessary due to any emergency, potential health hazard, and/or public nuisance.
6. Additional information concerning the design and operation of this facility shall be furnished on request and within a time frame specified by the LEA.
7. The operator shall properly maintain all facility equipment and structures according to the manufacturer's specifications and good engineering/ maintenance practices.
8. The receipt of non-friable asbestos-containing wastes (ACW) must be managed in a manner consistent with the 1996 RSI Appendix H Non-friable Asbestos Management Plan, the Cummings Road Landfill/City Garbage Company of Eureka asbestos acceptance policy, and CIWMB/LEA policy and applicable minimum standards. Transfer station personnel shall be trained in the requirements and procedures for managing ACW.
9. The operator shall comply with the hazardous waste screening program included in the 1996 RSI Appendix B City Garbage Company Load Checking Program. The operator shall provide information regarding alternative management options available to haulers with prohibited wastes discovered through routine load checking.
10. The facility may receive white goods (appliances) in accordance with regulatory requirements for the removal of CFCs and/or other liquid hazardous wastes.
11. Waste tires received by the transfer facility shall be stored in a manner which minimizes vector propagation and harborages. No more than 499 tires shall be stored at the facility unless all pertinent permits and approvals are obtained in writing by the appropriate agencies.
12. Transfer operations shall be maintained to minimize the propagation or attraction of flies, rodents or other vectors, the creation of nuisances by reasons of solid wastes being deposited, and the off-site migration of litter.
13. The operator shall comply with the provisions of Health & Safety Code Chapter 6.5 (Hazardous Waste Control Law) and California Code of Regulations Title 22.
14. The operator has the responsibility to comply with CCR Title 8, Section 3203 (OSHA Regulations) in the development of an Illness & Injury Prevention Plan (IIPP) for the facility.
15. This permit authorizes the operation of a transfer station as described and shown in Figure 3 of the RSI. The change in design and operation of the MRF described in Appendix G and shown in Figure 4 of the RSI shall not be authorized unless approved by the LEA through issuance of a tiered, or revised SWFP.
16. This permit supersedes the solid waste facility permit 12-AA-0033 issued May 30, 1978.

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
