12. Legal Description of Facility:

1001 W. Bradley Avenue, El Cajon, San Diego County, CA 92020

The property's legal description is described on Exhibit A of Appendix R of the Report of Station Information dated July 28, 1997.

13. Findings:

- a) Pursuant to Public Resources Code SJO001(a)(2), this solid waste facility is a material recovery facility and transfer station which is designed to, and which as a condition of its permit, will recovery for reuse or recycling at least 5 percent of the total volume of materials received by the facility, and which is identified in the amended City of El Cajon's nondisposal facility element, which has been approved pursuant to Public Resources Code S41800 or 41801.5. (A County-wide Integrated Waste Management Plan was approved by the CIWMB on June 25 1997).
- b) The LEA has determined that the design of the facility would allow for the facility operations to be conducted in compliance with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal, based on a review of the July 28, 1997 Report of Station Information.
- c) This permit is consistent with standards adopted by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB), Public Resources Code, S440 10.
- d) The LEA has reviewed and considered the information, including the environmental effects of issuing this Solid Waste Permit, contained in the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) prepared by the City of El Cajon and approved on July 14, 1997, and finds there are no significant unmitigatable environmental effects arising out of the issuance of this Solid Waste Permit. The LEA will file a Notice of Determination with the County Clerk upon the issuance of this new Solid Waste Facility Permit.

15. LEA Conclusions*

- a) Without prior written or verbal approval from the LEA to allow otherwise, waste may be accepted only during the hours described in the most current RSI.
- b) The permittee is prohibited from accepting any liquid waste sludge, non-hazardous waste requiring special handling, designated waste, hazardous waste, biohazardous waste, waste containing more than 50% water, friable and non-friable asbestos, large dead animals, and radioactive waste.
- c) The operator shall maintain a copy of this permit, Report of Station Information and State Minimum Standards for Transfer/Processing Station at the site at all times.
- d) The Operator shall recover for reuse or recycling at least five (5) percent of the total volume of material received by the facility.
- e) No significant change in design or operation of this facility shall be taken without prior application to and approval by the LEA (Public Resources Code 4 44004).
- f) Additional information related to compliance with this permit or information concerning the design and operation of this facility shall be furnished to the LEA upon request.
- g) Stored recyclables shall not interfere with facility operations or cause a public health nuisance as determined by the LEA. The LEA reserves the right to reduce the maximum storage time of recyclables necessary to protect health or prevent a nuisance.
- h) The operator shall maintain, and keep current, records of weight and types of waste received per day. These records shall include the final disposition of transferred waste and recycled materials (San Diego County Code of Regulatory Ordinances S 65.107).
- i) The operator shall maintain, and keep current, a record of the number and types of vehicles hauling waste to the facility.
- j) If the proposed dust control systems fail to be adequate for the control of dust in the operations of the facility, the LEA may require additional mitigation measures be installed.
- k) Stored greenwaste shall not interfere with facility operations or cause a public health nuisance as determined by the LEA. The LEA reserves the right to reduce the maximum storage time of greenwaste necessary to protect health or prevent a nuisance.
