1. Why does your jurisdiction need and Alternative Diversion Requirement? Describe why SRRE selected programs did not achieve 50% diversion. Identify barriers to meeting the 50% goal and briefly indicate how they will be overcome.

The City of Guadalupe made significant progress towards meeting its 50% goal. However, after review and submittal of the 1998 Annual Report, City officials began to discuss options for improving its diversion rate by modifying its collection service franchise requirements. The current contract was set to expire July 31, 2001. The City of Guadalupe prepared a RFP document for automated, curbside solid waste, recycling and green waste collection service in April 2001 anticipating the expiration of their current contract. A new contract was signed August 14, 2001 and includes this expanded collection service.

The Year 2000 recycling participation rate was 39% (as reported by Ralcco). This participation is lower than the City expected. Service included a 14-gallon blue box for recycling and customer-supplied green waste containers. The new service includes 90-gallon recycling and 90-gallon green waste wheeled-carts to improve both collection quantities and facilitate ease of participation. Participation rates, as well as diversion rates are expected to increase with the new service.

Guadalupe is a small, rural, economically-challenged community with approximately 60 businesses. Business recycling service will also be expanded with the new franchise. However, significant diversion from commercial is not expected.

2. Why is your jurisdiction requesting an Alternative Diversion Requirement in lieu of a Time Extension?

The City has requested an ADR in lieu of a TE because the City believes that despite its good faith efforts, it will be unable to meet the 50 percent goal.

The City of Guadalupe is requesting a ADR because its new three-stream collection franchise agreement is expected to increase the amount of material diverted from the waste stream. The new service expands recycling container volumes from 14 gallons to 90 gallons and will provide a 90 gallon container for green waste collection.

The City has also spoken with CIWMB staff regarding applying for a rural reduction because of its size, rural location, and agricultural-based economy. An extension will provide the additional time needed for the City to evaluate the effectiveness of its new collection system and the necessity of applying for such a reduction. The City is also expecting that the new franchise will provide for significantly improved record keeping over the previous contract. This will allow the City to review disposal records and better track diversion tonnage.

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3. Describe your jurisdiction's Good Faith Efforts to implement the programs in its SRRE.

Current diversion is at 38%. The City has mandatory recycling and green waste service. The City recently approved a new contract for solid waste, recycling and green waste collection citywide with a significant rate increase to improve the volume of diverted materials.

The City has contracted with Health Sanitation Services (August 2001) to expand the following programs.

Curbside Recycling - The City automated its collection in August 2001 and will be providing new 90 gal. containers for recycling to each residence. This will increase recycling container volume by 642%.

Curbside Greenwaste Collection - New 90 gallon green waste carts will be distributed to all residences.

Business Recycling Outreach - Health Sanitation Services has contacted each of the approximately 60 commercial accounts in the City to educate business owners on recycling services and ways to divert more materials.
