**1. Why does your jurisdiction need more time to meet the 50% goal? Describe why SRRE selected programs did not achieve 50% diversion. Identify barriers to meeting the 50% goal and briefly indicate how they will be overcome.**

With limited staff the City has attempted to expand other diversion programs such as green waste, office waste, blue bag and educational programs but unfortunately these efforts were not successful in raising the diversion amounts to meet the 50% diversion mandate. On average 20,000 Blue bags were distributed each quarter in the year 2000 to City residents. Auburn's participation in this program is the highest in the County, however direct credit is not given for these diverted recyclables. There are Institutional barriers when identifying potential programs. The City is required to ask permission from the County and the Western Placer Waste Management Authority as to whether the program is compatible with the infrastructure of the material recovery facility or whether direct credit will be given for efforts in such programs. Since the County has limited programs, whatever the City attempts to achieve through recycling programs seem to be swallowed up in the mix of the other jurisdictions. Where at the end of each year the diversion percentage is divided up to each jurisdiction by the County per population size. Therefore it seems unfair that smaller cities carry the weight of the County. This is obviously a concern of the City and needs to be addressed to ensure that the implementation of City programs is not hindered by the politics of the Western Placer Waste Management Authority.

The City planned to meet the 50% diversion goal in 2000, after reaching a goal of 47% in 1999. However, the City has encountered problems in gaining information on allocated waste, and has been unsuccessful in obtaining weight slips to ensure that the allocation is for waste actually generated within the City. The City therefore needs time to implement a Survey Week with assistance from the waste hauler to get a better handle of Disposal allocations and to measure waste and recycling activities for business waste and residential waste within the City.

Problems have been experienced with regards to Tire Waste residue sent to the Los Angeles Landfill. The City of Auburn was allocated for all tire waste in the Auburn area, whereas Placer County Unincorporated was allocated none. Even though the waste in this particular case was minimal it is an apparent problem which seems to occur when any waste is taken from one jurisdiction to another.

**2. Why does your jurisdiction need the amount of time requested? Describe any relevant circumstances in the jurisdiction that contribute to the need for a Time Extension.**

The City of Auburn is asking for a three year time extension to attempt to gain further information and develop a better relationship between the Western Placer Waste Management Authority and other jurisdictions, thus getting a better handle on waste allocation. Hopefully this will ensure that waste is allocated to the jurisdiction where it is generated and that the diversion credit is allocated per actual waste diverted. The City anticipates participating in a green waste program, to take more of the Cities generated green waste source separated to the Material Recovery Facility. This program will have to be coordinated with the WPWMA to gain accurate reports of green waste diverted. There are funding restraints to be considered in implementing these programs, and therefore rate increase and infrastructure need to be explored along with changes to Franchise Agreements with the Waste Hauler.

The City needs this time to implement a Construction and Demolition Ordinance to place requirements upon Contractors working within the City to separate their waste and provide information of waste generated. Other plans are to conduct a comprehensive survey week to monitor waste coming into the waste stream and also to measure accurate tonnage allocations from the source to the material recovery facility. During this survey process the City will be surveying local businesses and organizations to determine waste generated, recyclables diverted and other reduction programs conducted privately. This will give the City a better understanding of other recycling activities which are reducing waste from entering the waste stream.

This time extension is needed due to limited staff and the lengthy processes involved in preparation for public hearings and comments and City Council Meetings to approve the implementation of proposed programs.

**3. Describe your jurisdiction's Good Faith Efforts to implement the programs in its SRRE.**

Current Diversion is at 38%. The City has attempted to implement and expand the programs in the original SRRE to reduce waste at its source. Additional drop boxes were placed throughout the City, educational workshops and promotion of the blue bag recycling program were increased. The City also had relied upon the activities and recycling at the Material Recovery Facility to bring the numbers and percentage of diverted waste up to and beyond the required 50% diversion goal. It was apparent in the late 1990's that the diversion rates were not as high as anticipated. Funding and staffing for recycling programs was limited until 1999 when staff increased and funding sources were explored to add to and increase programs and recycling activities within the City limits. The City expanded the following programs:

Drop-Off locations: increased the number of locations and added bins for offices and businesses within the City.

Government Recycling Programs: Increased programs within City offices, to ensure sole purchase of recycled content paper and paper products, practice double-sided copying, use of email and paperless interoffice memo's, office paper recycling. Participated in the Department of Conservation City Grant Program and have implemented beverage container recycle receptacles for the general public to use.

Outreach: The City has increased marketing efforts to promote recycling and diversion opportunities available within both the City and County.

Education : The City has made efforts to reach local schools with recycling and composting information, competitions, available grants, CALMAX information and other available resources.

Composting: The City implemented a pilot Composting program, "Leaf It Out" where 30 totes were converted into backyard composting bins and made available to City residents to encourage backyard composting and lower the amounts of greenwaste in the waste stream. Pending the programs success, increased receptacles will be made available to City residents who wish to participate in the Backyard Composting system, in coincidence with a green waste bag program this could potentially increase a large percentage of the Cities generated waste.
