Agenda Items

1. Review CIWMB's environmental objectives for the EPP standard
 - EPP definition
 - Less cartridges landfilled or incinerated
 - Clear & concise criteria for "environmentally preferable"
 - Flexibility to achieve "environmentally preferable" status
 - Trying to "green" the products the State purchases and their recycling
 - Create a meaningful standard that achieves these goals

2. Review other critical standard parameters (e.g., tracking and reporting)
 - SKU & product specific designation
 - The standard should be measurable & verifiable
 - The standard should be easy to use

3. Establish life cycle aspects to be addressed by the standard
 - Quality
 - Safe recycling
 - Safe remanufacturing
 - Toxicity reduction

4. Develop alternatives for waste diversion monitoring and reporting
 - Potential collection rate
 - Potential recycling percentage
 - Exclusion of incineration

5. Discuss relevance and possible application of CIWMB's list of eco-criteria
 - Internationally there are cartridges that comply with these criteria
 - It has been acknowledged that the cartridge market is an international one
