Project Summary: The Spicer-Stemple Creek Clean-Up Project was first identified by the Marin County Sheriff's Department and County of Marin as a location where illegal dumping activity had been occurring over a period of time. The responsible dumping parties have not been identified and therefore cannot pay for remediation. The site is located approximately 15 minutes from the Sonoma County Landfill on an active livestock ranch just outside of Petaluma, CA. The site contains approximately 6 dozen tires, 2 cars, miscellaneous kitchen appliances, paint cans in addition to household trash. The Spicer Family has actively cleaned up sections of the unnamed tributary to Stemple Creek in years past but has not participated in dumping prevention programs. Stemple Creek is listed as a 303(d) listed/impaired waterbody by the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board for excessive sediments and nutrients. Special-status species in the watershed include California freshwater shrimp, northwestern pond turtle, Myrtle's silverspot butterfly, and California red-legged frog. This \$40,242 proposal includes remediation of the 1,584 linear foot site with the assistance of Conservation Corps North Bay's Natural Resources and Community Recycling Programs. The County of Marin will facilitate permitting with the agencies while the Marin Resource Conservation District will be the California Environmental Quality Act lead, proposal applicant and contract manager.
