# What Kinds of HHW Curbside Collection Programs Exist?

- Two Kinds
  - HHW Collection Programs that collect latex paint, used oil, oil filters, and universal waste from residences. Defined by HSC 25218.1(b) .
  - Used Oil/Oil Filter Only Curbside Collection Programs that collect only used oil and oil filters from residences. Defined by HSC 25250.15.

# HHW Curbside Collection Programs

- Are Defined as HHW Collection Facilities in HSC 25218.1(f)
- Must Submit DTSC form 1094B to CUPA – DTSC will get a copy
- Must follow Operational Requirements in for a permanent HHW Facility. (22CCR 67450.25)
- Must Use a Register Transporter

## HHW Curbside Collection Programs Cont.

- Pick Ups Limited to
- 5 gallons of used oil
- 10 lbs used oil filters
- 5 gallons of latex paint
- Fluorescent Tubes 4ft or Less
- Mercury waste must be securely packaged
- NO AUTOMOTIVE TYPE BATTERIES
- NO BUSINESS WASTE

# What is a Household?

HSC § 25218.1 (d) "Household" means a single detached residence or a single unit of a multiple residence unit and all appurtenant structures.

# Used Oil/Oil Filter Only Curbside Collection

**25250.15.** (a) Any person operating a refuse removal vehicle or a curbside collection vehicle used to collect or transport used oil which has been generated as a household waste or as part of a curbside recycling program, as defined by the board, is exempt from the requirements of Sections 25160 [manifesting] and subdivision (a) of Section 25163 [registration] of this **code** and Chapter 2.5 (commencing with Section 2500) of Division 2 of, Division 14.1 (commencing with Section 32000) of, and subdivision (g) of Section 34500 of, the **Vehicle Code**.

# Used Oil/Oil Filter Only Curbside Collection

- Must be operated by a refuse removal
- Do Not need a Hazardous Waste Permit (“PBR” Application) to operate.
- Do Not need to be a registered HW transporter
- Must follow Generator Standards at consolidation point
- Must follow Container Standards
- Must follow Tank Standards if applicable
- Waste is considered generated at consolidation point

# Used Oil/Oil Filter Only Curbside Collection Cont.

- May only collect used oil and properly drained used oil filters destined for scrap metal recycling
- May only collect from households
- No other hazardous wastes may be collected.
