HAZWOPER Refresher

This course is a "hand-on" interactive health and safety training class designed specifically for employees, supervisors, and managers for HHW, CESQG, and agricultural collection operations. Topics will include: Regulatory Overview, Universal Waste Requirements, Hazard Communication, Personal Protective Equipment, Respiratory Protection, Flammable and Combustible Materials, and Managing Emergencies at HHW Facilities. Completion of this class will meet the required annual Health & Safety Training, 8-hour Cal/OSHA HAZWOPER Refresher requirement (Title 8CCR 5192). Lunch is included.

HHW-CESQG Facility Design Basics

Remodeling or designing a new HHW/CESQG facility is a daunting task for most program manager that are not engineers or architects. Even if you have that training, there was no course called "Design for HHW Collection Facilities." Regardless of your background or education, to jump start your approach to increasing the service level, safety and efficiency of your operations, take this one-day short course on facility design. This course provides common sense approaches to an integrated and efficient design process for HHW facility development or redevelopment. It will help clear the fog of how to begin, what to consider, avoidance of pitfalls from others' mistakes, and answer questions about common approaches to satisfying the complex web of environmental, fire code, building code and safety requirements that are commonly applied to these special facilities. The course instructor encourages using the course to work on real facility plans at real sites. Participants are encouraged to bring their site plans or blueprints with them.
