



# Results from the Internet Survey of Hospice Providers




This Graph Shows That Most Hospice Providers Get Their Sharps From Chain Pharmacies (23%) Followed by Independent Pharmacies (20%)

### What Do the Respondents Do With The Sharps?




This Graphs Shows That Most Respondents Dispose of Sharps in a Strong Container and Then Into the Trash (45%).

### What Does Your Organization Pay Per Month for Disposal?




This Graphs Shows That Most Respondents Pay \$31-\$40 Per Month For Disposing of Sharps (40%)




This Graph Shows That Insurance Does Not Pay for the Majority Of Respondents' Disposal Costs (80%)

### Where Do the Respondents Receive Information About Sharps Disposal




This Graph Shows That Most Respondents Either Get Information from The Internet or From Other Sources

Disposal/Collection Locations**




This Graph Shows That The Majority of Respondents Felt That the Best Method to Distribute Information on Sharps Disposal is in Medical Health Publications.
