Illegal Dumping Procedures

1. Verify violations for illegal dumping
2. Make personal contact; in person/by phone
3. Search for evidence
4. Photograph and retrieve evidence
5. Attempt contact w/witnesses
6. Take evidence and contact violator
7. Research for any "priors"
8. Attempt contact; coordinate w/P.D.

After acquiring your Surveillance Camera?

1. Decide on a location
2. What will you focus on with your photos
3. Commercial areas; what hours?
4. Residential areas; realize privacy issues?
5. How to maintain camera
6. Maintenance budget

'Do's and Don'ts'

Do's

- Accuracy of your photos
- Secure camera in high enough location

Don'ts

- Underestimate sensor, distance, privacy issues, etc.
- Make easily accessible

Camera Maintenance

1. Change memory card
2. Clean solar panel
3. Clean lenses
4. Tape for "blinding" sensor

Budgets and Grants

- Efficient use of equipment versus labor


