

Mariposa Background



- Approximately 931,200 acres 452,384 acres publicly owned by NPS, USFS and BLM
 - ◆ Home of Yosemite
- Population- 2006 19,000 est.
- Over 3 million visitors to Yosemite annually
- Demographics
 - ◆ April 2000- July 2003, 3.9 % increase (State 4.8%)
 - ◆ Percent Change 1990-2000 19.8% (State 13.6 %)



Landfill

- Parcel 59 acres, 26 acres permitted Class III with maximum potential disposal acreage at 40
- Currently Operated by Mariposa County
 - ◆ Operation taken over February 1, 2005
- Home of the MSW Compost Facility

Landfill

- Permitted for 100 TPD
- Annual disposal average at 12,500 tons per year
- NPS materials- over one third of the material
- No Permanent HHW Facility
 - ◆ Agreement with Merced County
 - ◆ HHW events with Merced County
 - ◆ Planning Development of HHW Facility

Composting Facility Overview

- Location at existing Landfill Parcel
- Construction site approximately 3.1 acres
- 50,000 Square Foot Facility
- Designed capacity to accept 80 tons of MSW per
- Pre Compost Process includes additional recycling opportunities
- **Tipping Floor allows for easier and routine Load Checking**
- Project Includes Educational Viewing Rooms

Basic Process

■ Pre Compost Process

- ◆ Over Scales to tipping floor area for unloading

- ◆ ******LOAD CHECKING AND PULLING**

- ◆ Tipping floor to conveyor system
- ◆ Bag breaker, Electro Magnet and sort stations
- ◆ Screen
- ◆ Overs pulled
- ◆ Shredder/Mixer

■ Composting Process

- ◆ Loaded into vessels- compost 22-30 days
 - ◆ Electronic Computer monitoring for temperature etc.
 - ◆ Air controlled through a BIO FILTER
 - ◆ Leachate recirculated in closed system
- ◆ Unloaded to curing area
- ◆ Material then moved to landfill or market







LOAD CHECKING

- Mariposa updated program 2006-2007 uses following components
 - ◆ Education
 - ◆ Visual Observations
 - ◆ Physical Checking (Random Load Checking)
 - ◆ Consistency
 - ◆ Proper Unacceptable Wastes (materials) Handling
 - ◆ Documenting

Education

- Public Education
 - ◆ Signage, Notifications, Flyers, School & Groups Facility Tours
 - ◆ Verbal information conveyed through program by staff
 - ◆ Education for Agencies and Businesses.
 - ◆ Newspaper
 - ◆ Radio
 - ◆ Alternatives- take it back programs, handlers etc. Events and Existing Programs
- Staff Training
 - ◆ Educating personnel is critical
 - ◆ Formal Training and routine “tailgate meeting” updates
 - ◆ Refresher Training
- Haulers
 - ◆ Notification to customers
 - ◆ Mariposa County is embarking on a campaign with Haulers 2007

RECYCLE YOUR ELECTRONIC AND UNIVERSAL WASTES

What should you do with your electronic-waste or universal wastes? Now that you can't throw it in the landfill what do you do?

Due to Regulatory Changes from the State of California and for reducing potential environmental impacts, as of February 9, 2006 **the following items are no longer accepted for disposal or in the garbage at the Mariposa County Landfill, but will be accepted for recycling and proper handling.** These items are considered E-Waste (Electronic Waste) or U-Waste (Universal Waste) and must be separate from your waste going into the landfill or composting facility!

A sample list of items are hazardous in that they contain materials that have determined to be hazardous by the Department of Toxic Substances Control.

- Common Batteries such as AA, C, D AAA etc.
- Fluorescent Tubes and Mercury Containing Lamps
- Thermostats- Older Thermostats "Tilt Switch" Style
- Electronic Devices- TV's Computers, VCR's, cell Phones, Radios Etc.
- Electric Switches and Relays- pre 1972 Washing Machines, Freezers, electric space heaters, irons, ABS Brakes
- Pilot Light Sensors-Stoves, Ovens, Dryers, Water Heaters and furnaces and space heaters
- Mercury Gauges- barometers, blood pressure and vacuum gauges
- Mercury Novelties- Greeting cards that play music when opened Athletic Shoes with flashing lights made before 1997
- Mercury Thermometers

Non Empty aerosol cans

The Mariposa County Landfill, Compost and Recycling Facilities at 5593 Hwy 49 N., Mariposa Ca., will accept the materials above from County Residents and Businesses for proper handling and recycling at current rate charges for each item respectively. The items must be separated from the garbage, as we can no longer dispose of the materials in the Landfill per the regulations. **It is illegal for disposal of the materials in the garbage to the landfill, but it is legal to collect the materials through the programs at the facilities.** Mariposa County is a Certified Covered Electronic Waste Collector. Mariposa County is a participant in the Certified Appliance Recycler program.

For appliances, the switches need not be removed, but the appliances need to be separated from the materials going to the landfill. Please simply keep the items listed above separate from the garbage you wish to dispose of in the landfill and the attendant will direct you to the proper location for placement of the materials.

Maximum Quantities Accepted Per Trip:

- ♦ **20 gallons of used motor oil OR**
- ♦ **15 gallons OR 125 pounds of all other HHW**
- ♦ **Limit 3 batteries per vehicle**

**It is illegal to transport more than the listed amounts.
You may make more than one trip.**

No containers larger than 5 gallons will be accepted!

No businesses will be accepted at the one day collection events.

Staff Training

■ Classroom

- ◆ Regulatory Background
- ◆ Common Sense
- ◆ Public Relations/Education
- ◆ Documentation

■ Demonstrations

- ◆ Expresses visually some of the problems that can occur with hazmat in loads

■ Hands-On Physical

- ◆ Proper handling of materials in checking
- ◆ Proper tools and PPE to utilize



Used Oil Facts

- One gallon of used oil can contaminate 1 million gallons of drinking water or 100,000 gallons of fresh water.
- One quart of oil can contaminate 1 million gallons of water in the surface of water.
- Each year about 4 million gallons of automotive oil is sold in the United States.
- One 55-gallon drum of used oil is a potential fire and explosion hazard. The residue from 2 gallons of oil can contaminate 1 million gallons of water.



Visual Observations

- Consistent and persistent visual observations by spotters, operators, scale house employees.
- Visually Inspect the load
 - ◆ At the scalehouse, ask questions:
 - ◆ Where is the material from?
 - ◆ Do you have any hazardous materials such as paints, pesticides...
 - ◆ Notify the customer if there are any materials not allowed under the operating permit
- Notify spotter, tipping floor, tipping deck of the need for LOAD CHECK or Random Load Check.
- Notify the Customer in a courteous way





Physical Checking

- Use appropriate PPE
- Visually inspect first
- Provide information to customer
 - ◆ Flyer or verbal – Make sure to clearly indicate the importance of the program as first and foremost for safety and then education
- Be sure to use proper tools such as a poker, litter pickers etc.
- Any material found to be handled in conjunction with material type, stored properly etc.



Consistency

- Keep a method in place that works and keep using it!
- This keeps staff on track with program
- This keeps record format for reporting
- This keeps customers/public used to the system

Proper handling of materials

- Hazardous? Handling and storage for disposal or recycling at a permitted facility
- Universal? Handling and storage for disposal or recycling to permitted facilities or handlers
- On site Storage lockers for transport
- Contractors? ECS Refining, Interstate Battery, Stericycle, Evergreen Oil...

Documentation

- Log the visuals
- Log and fill out full check for records
- Keep manifests and or bill of lading from contractors
- Log interval- Weekly, Daily, 3 times a week???
- Transport in compliance with volumes, by material type
- Put Logs in a binder or in file with RFI or permit as required
- Send to LEA as required
