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12. Legal Description of Facility (attach map with RFI): the Facility location is 12310 San Mateo Rd, Half Moon Bay, CA. 13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the San Mateo County Integrated Solid Waste Management Plan (CIWMP). Public Resources Code, Section 50001.
- b. This permit is consistent with standards adopted by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB). Public Resources Code, Section 44010.
- c. Based on a review of the October 19, 2000 Report of Disposal Site Information (RDSI), and an inspection conducted on 01/03/01 the design and operation of the facility is in compliance with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal.
- d. A Negative Declaration (ND) approved on March 25, 1999 describes and supports the changes in design and operation which will be authorized by the issuance of a revised permit. The ND was prepared by the San Mateo County Planning and Building Division, and filed with the State Clearinghouse on August 6, 1998 (SCH# 98082020).
- e. The San Mateo County Planning and Building Division has made a determination that the facility is consistent with, and designated in, the applicable general plan: Public Resources Code, Section 50000.5(a).
- f. The San Mateo County Planning and Building Division has made a written finding that surrounding land use is compatible with the facility operation, as required in Public Resources Code, Section 50000.5(b).

14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Hazardous, radioactive, medical (as defined in Chapter 6.1, Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code), liquid, designated, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Report of Facility Information and as approved by the local enforcement agency and other federal, state and local agencies.

The permittee is additionally prohibited from the following activities:

- a. Scavenging
- b. Open burning
- c. Accepting dead animals
- d. Accepting flammable or infectious wastes

New operations may not begin without prior submittal of amendments to the RFI, the permit is revised or modified, and/or written approvals are received from the enforcement agency and other appropriate agencies.

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17. LEA Conditions:

- a. The October 19, 2000 RDSI and any subsequent approved RDSI Amendments shall reflect the current operation at this facility. The operator must file any proposed amendments to the LEA at least 150 days prior to making changes in the design and operation from those outlined in the RDSI. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of any proposed change. Such RDSI Amendments or lack thereof may become the basis for changes in the permit or for revocation of the permit.
- b. The design and operation of this facility shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as specified in Title 27, California Code of Regulations.
- c. The operator shall comply with all measures established in the Mitigation Monitoring Program pursuant to all certified environmental documents for this facility.
- d. The Facility Operator shall provide water misting equipment and effective dust control as necessary in order to control nuisance dust resulting from Facility operations, as determined by the LEA. The facility operator shall provide additional misting and watering as frequently as necessary to mitigate dust generation.
- e. Wood and Green waste shall not be stockpiled for more than seven (7) days prior to grinding. The LEA reserves the right to have the stockpiled material removed immediately where imminent public health and safety concerns exist, and reserves the right to require removal within 24-hours if it is determined that any other public nuisances exist.
- f. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the LEA.
- g. Stockpile cover material shall be maintained at close proximity to the working face for emergency use and to mitigate odor, vector or nuisance problems that may arise during operation. The quantity of stockpiled material shall be equivalent to the amount of cover material required to effectuate complete covering of the working face.
- h. The LEA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations when deemed necessary due to an emergency, a potential health hazard or the creation of a public nuisance.
- i. All Alternative Daily Cover Materials (ADC) proposed for use at this facility shall require written approval from the LEA and shall comply with all requirements specified in Title 27 California Code of Regulations Section 20690-CIWMB Alternate Daily Cover.
- j. The waste shall be spread and compacted in layers with a minimum of three (3) repeated passages of equipment so as to eliminate voids within the cell. The slope of the working face shall be maintained at a ratio that will allow effective compaction of the waste.
- k. The operator shall submit to the CIWMB, LEA and the RWQCB copies of the final closure and post closure maintenance plans for the landfill. These plans shall be submitted no later than two years prior to the anticipated date of closure.
- l. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 3598 tons per day, and the operator shall not accept more than this amount without a revision of this permit.
- m. This permit is subject to review by the LEA and may be suspended, modified or revised at any time for sufficient cause.
- n. A copy of this permit and all supporting documents shall be maintained at this facility.
- o. The operator shall provide adequate lighting for all operations conducted before sunrise and after sunset.
