Proposed Solid Waste Facility Permit Revision for the Mesquite Regional Landfill

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, in compliance with Section 21660.2 of Title 27 of the California Code of Regulations, that the Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) will be conducting an informational meeting regarding a proposed Solid Waste Facility Permit revision for the Mesquite Regional Landfill (Facility No. 13-AA-0026).

Date/Time: July 6, 2011 at 1:00 P.M.

Purpose: The meeting is being held to provide information about a proposed revision of the Solid Waste Facility Permit for the Mesquite Regional Landfill requested by the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County. The public will be offered the opportunity to comment and ask the LEA questions about the application package that was accepted for filing on June 15, 2011. A summary of comments from the informational meeting and any written comments received by the LEA prior to the meeting will be included with the proposed permit revision and accepted application package for consideration by the California State Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle).

Project Description: The proposed permit revision would allow up to 4,000 tons per day of waste from Los Angeles County to be delivered to the site by truck in support of the existing waste-by-rail landfill facility, and would also permit the acceptance of up to 600 tons per day of non-hazardous treated incinerator ash at the site for disposal. The existing peak traffic limits for the site of 50 transfer trucks per day delivering solid waste from Imperial County would be modified to also include up to a maximum of 220 truck deliveries per day originating from Los Angeles County. The total permitted daily disposal capacity remains unchanged at 20,000 tons per day.
