

What are they?



Certified Collection Centers are:

- Businesses or local government facilities that collect oil and are certified w/ CIWMB
- HHW Collection Facilities, ABOPs
- Auto Parts, Parts & Service, Quick Lube
- Auto Repair, Gas Station
- Specialty - Tune-Up, Tire, Muffler, others



Program Requirements


- Accepts used oil from public
- Offers recycling incentive of 16¢ per gallon
- Sign displayed
- Checks oil for contamination
- Directs DIYers with contaminated oil to proper HHW Collection Facility or Event
- Advertises twice yearly

Why Important?


- Approximately 8 M gallons of DIY oil is recycled each year.
- Certified collection centers account for 73% of all DIY oil collected
- Cost to grantee can be lower than curbside or HHW facilities



DIY Used Oil Collection



- Collection Centers 73%**
- HHW, ABOP Facilities 13%**
- Curbside 12%**
- Temp HHW Events 2%**





Non-governmental CCCs – Who collects the most?

- Auto Parts – 63% of CCC oil.

(= 46% of all DIY oil collected
from all sources)

Collection by CCC Type (CCC Gallons Only)





What can you do to help?

- Visit centers once or twice per year
- Bring Informational/Training Materials
- Explain claims paperwork
- Bring Signs (Pre-Order)




Supporting your CCCs

- Can use block grant \$\$ to fund:
- Coupons/Premiums for DIYers
- Oil tanks – pre-approval required
- Advertising for the center

Appreciate your CCCs


- Recognition

Collection Center Concerns

- Potential Contamination
- After Hours Drop-Off
“Midnight Oil”

Contaminated Oil



- > 1,000 ppm of chlorines
- Prevention: Pre-Screen
- Field Test Kit
Clor-D-Tect 1000
dexsil.com
- "Sniffers"
- Can use block grant \$\$
w/ pre-approval

- Each county has a contact for contaminated oil & HHW





Limitations of Testing

- Field Test Kits & Sniffers will not detect PCBs





PCB Prevention


One County's Solution:

- Take split sample
- Tank lock-out




Lab Results Clean -
Contact Hauler






Oil Screening




State Recommends:

- Pre-Screen visually, and also by asking questions of DIYer at time of collection
- If warranted, take split sample –
Do not send to lab unless
contamination is claimed by hauler



Okay, I'm stuck with contaminated oil – Now What?

- Pay for expense of hauling
- If Certified: File reimbursement claim for up to:
 - \$5,000 per certified center, per claim, per year



Contaminated Oil – A Perspective

- Last 4 fiscal years: 14 contaminated oil claims statewide
- Vs. 7,687 regular claims
(contaminated = 0.18% of all claims)

- All claims last 3 Fiscal Years : \$ 3,559,504
- Contaminated Claims paid: \$ 26,701






Cameras –real or fake


Do Not Drop-Off Signs





Operator Misconceptions

- Three common misconceptions Operators may have:
 1. - Can't take too much
 2. - Special container required
 3. - Can't take business oil



How much = too much?


- As of Jan 1, 2002:
Can accept up to 55 gallons

[Health & Safety Code section 25250.11(a)].
- No Special Container Required

Business Oil

- OK if: CESQG ("Squeegee")
($< 100 \text{ kg/mo} \sim 27 \text{ gal}$)
- Limit to 55 gal
- OK from Center before transporting 55 gal
- Keep Records




- Challenge to convince CCCs


