12. Legal Description of Facility:

The legal description of this facility is contained in page 2-1 of the Joint Technical Document dated February, 2013.

13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the Solano County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by Cal Recycle on April 24, 1997. The location of the facility is identified in the Amended Countywide Siting Element approved on July 17, 2012, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by the Cal Recycle, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the enforcement agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. The Dixon Fire Department has determined that the facility is in conformance with applicable fire standards, pursuant to PRC, 44151.
- e. A Mitigated Negative Declaration was filed with the State Clearinghouse (SCH #2004032138) and adopted by the Solano County Planning Commission on October 18, 2012. The Mitigated Negative Declaration describes and supports the design and operation, which will be authorized by the issuance of this permit. A Notice of Determination was filed with the State Clearinghouse on November 19, 2012.
- f. The operator has made proper notification to and received approval from the Travis Air Force Base and Federal Aviation Administration in conformance with CCR Title 27, Sections 20270 & 21600 (b) (A).

14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Hazardous, radioactive, medical (as defined in Chapter 6.1, Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code), liquid, designated, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Report of Facility Information and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the enforcement agency and other federal, state, and local agencies.

- a. Scavenging is not permitted.
- b. Open burning.
- c. Disposal shall occur only in those areas as specified in the most current Joint Technical Document and approved by all regulatory agencies.
- d. The handling of prohibited wastes shall be done by employees who are adequately trained and equipped.
- e. New operations may not begin without the prior submittal of amendments to the February, 2013 Joint Technical Document and any necessary permit revisions or modifications, and/or written approvals from all other regulatory agencies.
- f. The handling or disposal of solid wastes may be prohibited in order to protect the public health or the environment.
- g. The operator shall not allow standing water on covered fills.
- h. Additional prohibitions may be required upon notice from the LEA or Cal Recycle.

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16. Self-Monitoring:

a. Record a receipt of a Notice of Violation or any other legal enforcement action taken against the facility by any responsible regulatory agency.	Next Business Day

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17. Enforcement Agency (EA) Conditions:

- a. The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 27, California Code of Regulations.
- b. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous or unpermitted wastes, and significant injuries, accidents or property damage. Each log entry shall be accompanied by a summary of any actions taken by the operator to mitigate the occurrence. The log shall be available to site personnel and the LEA at all times.
- c. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the LEA.
- d. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 2400 tons per day for disposal and the landfill shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit. Waste materials utilized for beneficial re-use shall not be counted towards the permitted tonnage limit. The maximum permitted tonnage for asbestos is 2500 tons per month and the landfill shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit.
- e. This permit is subject to review by the LEA and may be temporarily suspended, revoked, or revised at any time by the LEA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resource Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Section 44305 et seq.
- f. The LEA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations when deemed necessary due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
- g. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of an RFI amendment, to the LEA at least 180 days in advance of the change.
- h. A copy of this permit shall be maintained at the facility and be made available to facility and enforcement agency personnel.
- i. The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 14, California Code of Regulations.
- j. Waste tire storage and disposal shall be done in accordance with CCR Title 14, Section 17350.
- k. The acceptance of storage, handling, and disposal, reuse, drying and mixing of bio-solids shall be done in accordance with JTD.
- l. The facility is permitted to dispose of designated waste as permitted by the LEA and described in the JTD. These wastes may include contaminated soils and construction waste with adhered paint.
- m. Final Closure and Post-closure plans shall be submitted at two years prior to final disposal of waste at the landfill.
- n. During 24 hour operation days, waste material placed for disposal shall be covered with an approved cover material on top and side of the landfill at least once every 24 hours.
- o. At any time, the LEA shall be provided access to inspect the waste load from any vehicle.
- p. A trained attendant shall be present at all times to direct traffic and advise on unloading waste at the active face.
- q. The operator shall maintain records lengths and depths of cuts made in natural terrain where fill is placed including the ground water depth.
- r. The operator shall continue to monitor for leachate generation. Leachate shall be handled as described in JTD.

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- s. The operator shall submit all copies of correspondence between the landfill and other regulatory agencies to the LEA.
- t. Handle and store all recyclable material from the waste stream as described in the approved JTD.
- u. To facilitate the attainment of AB939 diversion goals as described in PRC Section 41780, the facility shall:
 - Submit as outlined in the Self-Monitoring Program appropriate records of types and quantities of diverted materials including conversion factors for wastes recycled not weighed.
 - Handle and store all recyclable materials from the waste stream as described in the approved JTD.
- v. Conduct the wood processing area and storage operations as described in the approved JTD. Wood waste can be stored up 70,000 cubic yards. The wood waste shall be removed at least once every 6 months.
- w. The handling of asbestos containing waste (ACW) shall be done in accordance with all applicable regulations and Appendix G in the approved JTD. The disposal shall be confined to Disposal Module DM-1.
- x. Concrete and asphalt may be diverted from the waste stream and stockpiled as described in the approved JTD. No more than 15,000 cubic yards can be on-site at any one time.
- y. Freon containing appliances and universal waste shall be handled as described in the approved JTD. Vehicle batteries, used oil, oil filters shall be segregated from the waste stream, stored separately, and recycled.
- z. The operator shall submit a five year permit review application including an updated Joint Technical Document 150 days before the next five year permit review is due.
- aa. The operator may not make a significant change in operation or design of the facility that is not authorized by this permit. A permit revision may be required before the significant changes shall be made.
- bb. The LEA reserves the right to require additional controls as to adequately manage nuisances resulting from landfill operations.
- cc. The operator shall comply with the approved Waste Load Checking Program as described in the approved JTD. Any changes in the program must be approved by the LEA prior to implementation. The operator shall comply with CCR Title 27, Section 20870.
- dd. The landfill personnel involved in the waste load checking program shall be trained. Landfill workers shall be re-trained on annual basis.
- ee. No more than 3,000 cubic yards of ADC can be stored on the facility near the active face of the landfill.
- ff. Fencing around the perimeter of the landfill property shall be adequately maintained as determined by the LEA.
- gg. Adequate lighting shall be provided for all work done after daylight hours as described in the JTD.
- hh. An adequate water supply for dust control and fire suppression must be available at all times during the operation of the landfill.
- ii. At all times there shall be adequate number and type of operable equipment for the operation of the landfill. Information as to location of backup equipment shall be readily available at the site.
- jj. The Jepson Prairie Organics composting facility has a permitted acreage of 54 acres of the landfill footprint. The landfill operation in the future will develop this area for landfilling of solid wastes.
- kk. A Compliance officer shall be designated to prevent off-site migration of airborne contaminants including a monitoring and record keeping program.
- ll. Proposed use of ADC not specified in Section 20690 shall be subject to demonstration project approved by the LEA with concurrence by Cal Recycle.
- mm. The operator shall at all times provide adequate staffing to deal effectively with landfill operations as determined by the LEA. Landfill personnel shall be adequately outfitted to ensure health and safety.
- nn. This permit supersedes all previous Solid Waste Facilities Permit for this site.
