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12. Legal Description of Facility:

The legal description of this facility is: North ½ of Government Lot 2 of the SW ¼ of Section 7; Township 4 South; Range 6 East, SBBM and is contained in the Conditional Use Permit (CUP) 3252 R4 EA Number 42522 dated July 1, 2014.

13. Findings:

- a. This permit is consistent with the Riverside County Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was approved by CalRecycle and amended on April 2009. The location of the facility is identified in the Nondisposal Facility Element, pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC), Section 50001(a).
- b. This permit is consistent with the standards adopted by CalRecycle, pursuant to PRC 44010.
- c. The design and operation of the facility is consistent with the State Minimum Standards for Solid Waste Handling and Disposal as determined by the enforcement agency, pursuant to PRC 44009.
- d. The Riverside County Fire Department has determined that the facility is in conformance with applicable fire standards, pursuant to PRC, 44151.
- e. A Mitigated Negative Declaration was filed with the State Clearinghouse SCH #2013101095 and certified by the Riverside County Planning Department on July 1, 2014. The Mitigated Negative Declaration describes and supports the design and operation which will be authorized by the issuance of this permit. A Notice of Determination was filed with the State Clearinghouse on July 14, 2014.
- f. The Certified Appliance Recycler (CAR) Number 0123 remains current for the recycling of metals, white goods and end of life vehicles.

14. Prohibitions:

The permittee is prohibited from accepting the following wastes:

Hazardous, radioactive, medical (as defined in Chapter 6.1, Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code), liquid, designated, or other wastes requiring special treatment or handling, except as identified in the Report of Composting Site Information/ Operations Plan and approved amendments thereto and as approved by the enforcement agency.

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16. Self Monitoring:

The owner/operator shall submit the results of all self monitoring programs to the Enforcement Agency within 30 days of the end of the reporting period (*for example, 1st quarter = January – March, the report is due by April 30, etc.. Information required on an annual basis shall be submitted with the 4th quarter monitoring report, unless otherwise stated.*)

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17. Enforcement Agency (EA) Conditions:

- a. The operator shall comply with all State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations.
- b. The operator shall maintain a log of special/unusual occurrences. This log shall include, but is not limited to, fires, explosions, the discharge and disposition of hazardous or unpermitted wastes, and significant injuries, accidents or property damage. Each log entry shall be accompanied by a summary of any actions taken by the operator to mitigate the occurrence. The log shall be available to site personnel and the EA at all times.
- c. Additional information concerning the design and operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request and within the time frame specified by the EA.
- d. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 3,000 tons per day, and shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit. The facility is permitted to receive the following non-hazardous waste: yard trimmings, untreated wood waste, construction and demolition wood waste, palm, asphalt and concrete.
- e. This permit is subject to review by the EA and may be temporarily suspended or revoked at any time by the EA for sufficient cause, in accordance with Division 30 of the Public Resource Code, Part 4, Chapter 4, Article 2, Sections 44305 et seq and associated regulations.
- f. The EA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving and handling operations due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
- g. Any change that would cause the design or operation of the facility not to conform to the terms and conditions of this permit is prohibited. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of an RFI amendment, to the EA at least 180 days in advance of the change.
- h. The operator shall maintain a copy of this permit during normal office hours. In addition, the Report of Composting Site Information (RCSI), Odor Impact Minimization Plan (OIMP), Operation Plan and Fire, Prevention Mitigation and Control Plan, tonnage reports, load check results, temperature logs, process for further reducing pathogens (PFRP) logs, all sampling results and complaints shall be maintained onsite.
- i. The site shall maintain a formal load checking hazardous waste monitoring program that is approved by the enforcement agency. The operator shall provide employee training to address the recognition and proper response to hazardous material incidents.
- j. Processed inerts shall be stored onsite no longer than 18 months.
- k. The operator shall maintain and make available upon request for inspections for the enforcement agency and CalRecycle, all correspondence and reports provided to other regulatory agencies that have jurisdiction over the design and operations of the facility.
- l. Contaminants and residuals shall be handled as enumerated in the RCSI and Operation Plan.
