

I have four questions:

- 1) Will CalRecycle use this process to explicitly close the gap between permitted capacity and actual throughput that already exists?
- 2) Will you prioritize the funding of low cost, low emissions compost technologies on *existing permitted capacity sites*?
- 3) Is CalRecycle open to establishing a process to provide organics market intelligence ongoing, based coordinating existing data?
- 4) What's the process for providing this input in a more formal basis this month, especially for enhancing the "Scoring Criteria"?
