A2. Note on types and number of analysis performed under the current FY06-08 Laboratory Services Contract IWM 5077: Based on the latest environmental services contract (IWM-5077), the primary Board program utilizing the Laboratory Services Contract has been the Closed, Illegal and Abandoned site program. The CIA program has utilized laboratory services to analyze soil, burn ash and landfill gas samples collected during investigations at several former disposal sites throughout California, e.g. Fortuna Dump in Humboldt County, Benton Dump in the City of Escondido, Truckee Regional Park Burn site (Nevada County), La Veta Burn Site in Orange County, Duarte Golf Course and Disposal Gardens in Los Angeles County, Rocklin Dump in Placer County and Dixon Pit in Sacramento County. During these investigations approximately 121 landfill gas samples were collected using primarily Summa Cannisters and analyzed using EPA Method T.O.-15, ASTM 1946 Fixed Gases and EPA Method T.O.-3 Carbon Speciation. Approximately 337 soil and ash samples were collected from 5 field investigation projects and analyzed for CAM 17 Metals (STLC/TTLIC), TPH, Dioxins and Furans, Semivolatiles, Pesticides and PCBs. It should be noted that the below tests are capabilities the Board is seeking to obtain to support boardwide functions not just the CIA program; thus although no water or wastewater analysis was required by the CIA program, it may be required by another CIWMB program (Enforcement Agency Program, Permits, Closure, etc).
