

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
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Lesson 1


life cycle

The changes organisms go through as they develop from eggs or seeds to adults that reproduce before they die.



reproduction

How plants and animals make new plants and animals like themselves.



Lesson 2

egg

The object that many female animals make to reproduce.



seed

(noun) The object that many plants make to reproduce. (verb) To spread seeds.



Lesson 3

hatch

To come out of an egg.



metamorphosis

A change in the form of an animal, such as the change from larva to pupa to adult butterfly.



Lesson 4


habitat

The place where an animal or plant lives and meets its needs.



migrate


To travel from one place to another, often as part of a seasonal cycle.

Things that people use from nature, like wood from forests and water from rivers.
