Staff clarified that the main change was to eliminate the restrictive language in this section that currently limits the use of the Streamlined Penalty for waste tire facilities by requiring a Cleanup and Abatement Order before issuing a penalty. Waste tire facility violation cases that involve 2,000 or more waste tires, have potential penalties of \$5,000 or more, or are controversial do not fall under the criteria of the Streamlined Penalty Process and would be subject to the Cleanup and Abatement Order Process. P01-01	Registered Hauler 6/4/2010	Caller thought the notice of extended informal comment period was a letter regarding his specific hauler business. Stated he only had 50-100 tires at his site at any time and wondered how this change would affect his business.	Explained to caller that the notice was announcing a proposed change to the rules related to waste tire storage violators. He was told that as long as he complied with the rules then he would have no problems and that the local inspector would be the one to discuss his business operations. He said he has already and is in compliance. Staff told him that he could submit comments if he wanted.	No	General
